

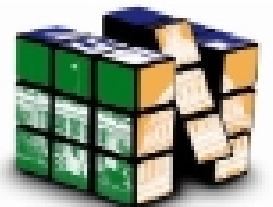

Nationalization of Civil Liberties

- Reining in majorities
- Bill of Rights checks majority rule
 - designed to limit the capacity of government to impose conformity costs on those individuals and minorities whose views differ from those of the majority
