Contextual Comments

Provide at least **three** substantial comments. Do not comment on matters such as grammar, mechanics, or spelling; instead, choose more substantial aspects of the draft for your feedback.

Your comments should focus on helping this writer see areas where they still need to strengthen their analytical skills.

Each comment should follow "describe-evaluate-suggest:"

- Describe what part of the draft you are talking about and assume that writers cannot see what you have highlighted
- Evaluate it by naming which criteria you are talking about from the list above (course texts, engagement, or rhetorical accommodation) and saying how effective the passage is and why
- Suggest a strategy or question or goal the writer should consider when revising
