die Lyrik: poetry

die Zeitung: newspaper

### Deutsch Zeitung

-Germans spend a lot time with newspapers

-unabhängig: independent

FAZ (Frankfurter Allgemeine Zeitung): conservative and focuses on money (ex: Wall Street Journal)

SZ (Süddeutsche Zeitung): centered in Munich, conservative

Die Zeit: centered in Hamburg, supports Social Democrats

TAZ (Die Tageszeitung): independent newspaper, liberal, based in Berlin

Logo is pronounced Tatz

Tatze means paw

### Die Zeitschriften

Der Spiegel: largest magazine in circulation & size

Weekly magazine cover to cover

Spiegel: mirror

Writers make up words, gossip

FOCUS: competes with Spiegel

Smaller in circulation and in magazine size

Author opinions run wild

Motto: Fakten, Fakten, Fakten

Stern: low-brow look at culture & news

Took a big hit when it released Hitler's diary (Tagebuch) in 1983

Profil: the main news magazine for Austria

Bild und Krone

Die Bildung: most read newspaper in Germany

Full of scandal, gossip, and disasters

Considered a negative influence on German society

Krone: the Bild in Austria

Krone means crown

Belletristik: literature

-Germans emphasis on being well-read

-Märchen: fairy tales

Allgemeinwissen: common knowledge

die Buchhandlung: bookstore

Buchpreisbindung: law that fixed the price of books throughout Germany

Method is preserve the bookstore and reader culture

10.2.3 Famous German Authors

Goethe

-Most famous author of his time

-Known for "Sturm und Drang," "Faust," and "The Sorrows of Young Werther"

Hermann Hesse

-His work was prohibited during WWII under Nazi control

-Wrote "Steppenwolf" and "Siddhartha"

Franz Kafka

-Famous writer from Austria and had great importance to world literature

-Known for "The Metamorphosis" and "The Trial" (Der Prozess)

Rainer Maria Rilke

-Wrote poetry

-Traveled a lot and based her writing off of her travels

-Famous for "Der Panther" and "Herbsttag"

-Also learned to be a great artist

Günther Grass

-Known for his glasses, mustache, and for smoking a pipe

-Received a Nobel Prize

-Wrote "Die Blechtrommel" (The Tin Drum) & "Cat and Mouse"

Thomas Mann

-Won a Nobel Prize for his literature

-He was persecuted for his work during Nazi-occupied Germany

-He and his family fled to Switzerland

-Famous for "Buddenbrooks" and the novel "Der Tod in Venedig" (about homosexuality)

10.2.6 Karl May

-One of Germany's most popular authors

-Genre was pulp fiction and lowbrow

-Was a thug in his earlier days (served 2 prison sentences)

-Later focus was on the American Wild West (he never traveled there)
