**Chemistry 100** is a one term introductory chemistry class for students who are interested in the subject or need it for their degree. This course will help prepare students for successful entry to general college chemistry courses. The lecture portion of the course presents basic chemical principles, computations and selected topics of interest relating chemistry to the modern world. The laboratory period provides an opportunity to have hands-on experience of concepts presented in class as well as an introduction to simple laboratory techniques. The course is transferable as general science credit.
