1. *Homo erectus* evolved on what continent? (0.5)
2. What *Homo erectus* **stone tools** were found at the site of Koobi Fora? (0.5)
3. **How** could we tell the tools and bones found were cultural as opposed to natural occurrences? **What** did the archaeologists do to **test their hypotheses** about these remains? (2 points)
4. The authors of the movie hypothesize they found a *Homo erectus* "home base" camp. **What are their arguments** to support this hypothesis? (3 points)

Richard Leakey turns to the modern-day !Kung in the Kalahari desert of northern Botswana for ethnographic analogies to *Homo erectus* behavior. Although the !Kung are no longer isolated and they have modern goods, they still depend to a high degree on hunting and gathering.

5. What kinds of hunter-gatherer *behavior* (as illustrated by the !Kung) might it be possible to decipher **from the archaeological remains**? Remember that most organic remains would not be preserved archaeologically, so you will have to look for other forms of evidence. (2 pts)

6. What surprised *you* most about the !Kung, or what did you find most interesting? List at least **two** items. (2 points)
