Culture: dynamic system of adaptation
organize life including ideas, beliefs/values

Society: organized group of interdependent
people who share a common territory,
language and culture / who act together
for collective survival and well being

Ethnic groups: group of people sharing a common
sense of identity and common culture

- * Subcultures: standards / rules practiced by a
specific group within a society

Pluralistic: society inhabited by many ethnic groups
