Product Liability

- When goods cause injury, there is a question of product liability.
- There are three main issues related to product liability cases:
 - Warranty -- a contractual assurance that goods will meet certain standards.
 - Negligence – unreasonable conduct by the defendant.
 - Strict Liability – policy which holds the defendant liable regardless of his behavior.
