

Ethnicity- learned behaviors

Race-

Thick identity- White, dictates much of your everyday life

Thin identity- Irish

Passive racism- don't say anything races but you allow people to say races stuff in front of you

Color blind racism- "I'm not racist, but"

Naturalism statements- We all like to stick to our own kind

Racialization

Assimilation- theory assumed that most immigrants would behave as the dominant group within 3rd or 4th generation, black people cant be assimilated because their color skin

Segmented assimilation- you can't assimilate at the same rate human capital- education and money social capital- social ties that immigrants already come into high capital makes it easier to assimilate

Downward assimilation- don't try because you don't know what its like where you come from so they make own identity reactive identity formation- in reaction to all barriers faced

Desegregation- Plessy v. Ferguson (1896)- separate but equal

Brown v. Board of Education (1954)-tried to desegregate the schools

Many students faced hardships, including violence

North and South desegregated at different rates

Led to such public policies like **busing**-failed to work because many white parents simply moved or sent there kids to private schools, most black students and parents did not have this as an option

Confirmation bias- black people are violent and you see black people in fight, even though you've seen black people be not violent, ignore so you can confirm you bias

Resegregation

Several laws in 1980s and 1990s reintroduce segregation to schools

Board of education of Oklahoma v. Dowell (1991) court held that "unitary status" released the districts from its obligation to maintain desegregation

Residential Segregation

Minimal heterogeneity- not a lot of diversity

Redlining- realtors were trained to sell properties according to race

If blacks asked about house in white neighborhood, they were offered higher prices and higher mortgage rates

Genocide- mass killing of a group of people

Think about Holocaust, but what about Rwanda, Darfur, and Syria

Cognitive Dissonance- empathize with people of same color
